MARIETTA COLLEGE

When you're a Pioneer, you're part of a diverse and vibrant campus experience.

Marietta College traces its beginnings to the establishment of the Muskingum Academy, which was founded by pioneer settlers in 1797, in Marietta, Ohio. The Academy became the first institute of higher education in the Northwest Territory.

In 1835 Marietta College received its charter from the State of Ohio to offer college-level degrees. As a result, 173 years later, Marietta College now includes more than 40 buildings over 90 acres located two blocks from downtown Marietta.

Marietta College is a private, nonsectarian, coeducational, contemporary liberal arts college. As an institution of higher education, Marietta seeks to prepare highly qualified graduates through its educational programs. The College offers Bachelor of Arts, Bachelor of Science, Bachelor of Science in Petroleum Engineering, and Bachelor of Fine Arts degrees, as well as three graduate degrees. Consistently ranked by U.S. News and World Report among the best liberal arts colleges in the Midwest, Marietta has attained national recognition for many of its programs, including studies in leadership education.

The fall enrollment of the College was 1,450, including students from 42 states and 10 countries. The male-to-female ratio is nearly 50:50, and the student-to-faculty ratio is 12:1.

The community of Marietta, Ohio, was settled in 1788 by Revolutionary War veterans and became the first settlement of the Northwest Territory. Now a city of 14,000, Marietta saw its greatest growth during the oil boom of the late 19th century. Still, Marietta has retained a particular pioneer spirit of independence and outward New England charm. Its historical significance also makes Marietta a popular location for tourists around the country.

Marietta is a riverboat town situated at the confluence of the Ohio and Muskingum rivers, and many of the community's most important celebrations and activities are associated with the rivers.

Marietta is part of the Marietta-Parkersburg metropolitan area, which has a population of more than 130,000.





YOUTH MOVEMENT

Marietta College women's soccer will look to bounce back in the Ohio Athletic Conference (OAC) after once again finishing the season without an OAC Tournament berth. Head Coach Patrick Holguin has brought in his biggest freshmen class since taking over the women's program nine years ago. Having to replace seven starters will make this squad one of the youngest teams that Coach Holguin has put on the field during his tenure at Marietta.

Senior forward Jessica Martinez will provide the Pioneers with its offensive spark and leadership. Martinez led the team in goals and points a year ago on her way to earning All-OAC honorable mention. Fellow senior Allie Williams looks to once again lead the midfield after suffering a knee injury last season.

The Pioneers return two starters on defense. Senior defender Kristine Troyer brings her experience back to anchor the Pioneer defense. Sophomore Helen Hetzel will return between the posts for Marietta. Hetzel recorded over 1,200 minutes as a starter and posted a .773 save percentage.

The Pioneers open the season at home against Bethany (W.Va.) College on Aug. 30. The annual Marietta College Classic will take place Sept. 6-7. Marietta will take on Walsh University in the first game on Saturday. SUNY-Brockport (N.Y.) will battle Westminster (Pa.) in the other women's match-up of the tournament. The consolation and championship games are slated for Sunday. Marietta will once again play two games at Penn State-Altoona (Pa.) on Sept. 13-14. The Pioneers will then open OAC play at Heidelberg on Oct. 3.

HEAD COACH PATRICK HOLGUIN

Holguin starts his ninth season with the women

Patrick Holguin enters his ninth season as the women's head coach; it will also be his 11th year leading the men's team.

Sporting a career record of 77-50-15 (.595) with the women's program, Holguin has the best winning percentage of any coach in team history. He is also the only coach in school history to achieve 12 wins in a season, a feat he accomplished in 2003 and 2004. Holguin's 2003 crew was also responsible for claiming Marietta's



best Ohio Athletic Conference finish (two-way tie for third) since 1991. He then led his 2005 Pioneers to a school-record 14 wins. Under his direction, the women have racked up 25 All-OAC and 15 Academic All-OAC honors. In addition, four athletes were named Clyde A. Lamb recipients and one received the Betty Cleland award.

Holguin has achieved similar success with the men's program, compiling a 66-93-15 (.422) career record. Holguin's winning percentage ranks fifth among Pioneer coaches. Last year, he guided the men to a late-season run and earned the school's first OAC Tournament berth in 10 seasons. In 2002, his team finished the season 12-5-2, the most victories by a squad since 1984. Holguin's athletes have accumulated 15 All-OAC and 12 Academic All-OAC honors. Among them is Marcos Vaca, only the second player in Marietta history to earn All-OAC honors for four straight years (2001-04).

A 1989 graduate from Quinnipiac College with a degree in international business, Holguin began his coaching career in Houston, Texas. From 1993-97, he was the head coach of the men and women's club soccer program at the University of Houston. He was also involved as a coach with the South Texas Olympic Development Program and was the Director of Player Development and Coaching with the Alliance Soccer Program.

Holguin remains involved with the Olympic Development Program in West Virginia. He was also the Director of Player Development and Coaching for the River Valley Soccer Club from 1999-2003. Holguin returned to the role in 2008.

Holguin, who lives in Marietta, earned a master's degree in education from Marietta College in 2008.

ASSISTANT COACH STEPHEN ROSE

Stephen Rose begins his fourth year as an assistant coach for the men and women's soccer programs at Marietta College. It is his second as a full-time member of the department; he also assists in the sports information office.

A graduate of Marietta High School, Rose returned to his hometown after attending Walsh University where he received his undergraduate degree in communications. He was a four-year starter for the Cavaliers and garnered All-American Mideast Conference (AMC) honors twice. Rose also played basketball at Walsh for one season.

In addition to his collegiate playing experience, Rose was also a successful player with the local River Valley Soccer Club. Considering his club coach was Patrick Holguin, Rose feels right at home on the Marietta College soccer coaching staff.

Rose earned his United States Soccer Federation (USSF) "D" license in 2006 and his National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) National Diploma in 2008. He remains active with the River Valley Soccer Club, where he coaches boys teams, ranging from under-16 to under-18. Rose also coordinates all of the local youth soccer tournaments and camps at Marietta College.

Rose, who lives in Marietta, completed his Master of Arts in Liberal Learning in the spring of 2007.

OHIO ATHLETIC CONFERENCE

D-III's Best Conference

The Ohio Athletic Conference, the third oldest conference in college athletics, is predated only by the Michigan Intercollegiate Athletic Association (1888) and the Big Ten (1895). The Conference is older than the World Series and even the NCAA itself and has survived two world wars, the Great Depression, the Korean War and the Vietnam Conflict. From a modest beginning of six charter members in 1902, the OAC grew to as many as 24 members in the mid-1920s.

Through the years, a total of 31 colleges and universities at one time or another have been members of the OAC. Currently the Conference consists of 10 members, including Baldwin-Wallace College, Capital University, Heidelberg College, John Carroll University, Marietta College, Mount Union College, Muskingum College, Ohio Northern University, Otterbein College and Wilmington College. Wilmington became the 31st OAC member school on July 1, 2000.

The Conference currently sponsors championships in 21 sports, 11 men's and 10 women's.

The enrollments at the 10 OAC institutions range from 1,200 to 4,500. All of the schools were founded in the 19th century and have long and outstanding academic reputations.

The 2007-08 year proved, once again, why the OAC is one of the

most prestigious Division III conferences in the country. The Mount Union football team advanced to their 11th Stagg Bowl, while Capital advanced to the NCAA Playoffs for the third consecutive time. The Ohio Northern volleyball team made its eighth straight NCAA



III Tournament appearance and the program recorded its NCAA-record 31st straight winning season. The Heidelberg volleyball team reached the NCAA Regional Semifinals following an appearance in the OAC Tournament Finals. The Muskingum softball team advanced to the Division III World Series for the eighth time. Heidelberg wrestling sent five to the NCAA Division III National Tournament and placed two. The Otterbein women's golf team placed fifth at the NCAA Tournament, while the Mount Union men placed 12th.

Individually, the Conference was represented by 64 All-Americans and two national titles in track and field. Mount Union's Dan Gund won the outdoor shot put title and Heidelberg's Judy Bataille claimed the indoor 55-meter dash title. Academically, the OAC boasted numerous CoSIDA ESPN the Magazine Academic All-Americans, along with regional and national coaching honors.

MARIETTA FIELD

Patrick Holguin's vision of having one of the nicest natural grass soccer facilities in the region is now a reality. Marietta Field, the long-time home of Marietta College soccer, underwent the final phase of its evolution this summer. The construction of a press box and storage facility completed the dream of the 11th-year head soccer coach.

"Marietta College soccer is blessed to have one of the finest, natural grass soccer complexes around," Holguin said. "The beautiful facility would not be possible without the tremendous financial support of the Parents Campaign and those that gave through the Pioneer Club."

The Parents Campaign for the Field Project, led by Bob and Nancy Gessner, was formed in 2004 to secure funding for the initial improvements to the soccer field on the south end of campus. Remaining money from that project, as well as additional funds raised by the Pioneer Club, allowed for the addition of the press box.

The facility underwent a complete renovation before the 2005 season. The College installed a new natural-grass, laser-leveled playing surface with a state-of-the-art draining and sprinkler system, as well as bleachers and a walkway connecting it to the rest of campus.

The first competition on the new field was the 2005 Marietta College Classic, held the first weekend of September.

MARIETTA ADMINISTRATION

President, Dr. Jean A. Scott

A new era began at Marietta College on July 15, 2000, when Dr. Jean A. Scott became the 17th President of the College. She is the first female president at Marietta College.

Most recently, Scott was president of Bradford College, in Haverhill, Mass.

Scott graduated with a major in history from Westhampton College at the University of Richmond where she was elected Phi Beta Kappa and earned her A.B. degree in 1968. She then attended Harvard University and received her M.A. in history in 1969 and her Ph.D. in history in 1974.

Directions to Marietta College

From Exit 1 Marietta:

Bear right from exit ramp. At sixth light turn right (at Kentucky Fried Chicken or Fourth Street). Visitors' Parking Lot is one block on the right.

From Cincinnati:

From Columbus:
